
Here are foods that are a good source of omega-3's.




John (Corky) Charles Schneider, 90, of Lake Havasu City passed away on July 21, 2019. Corky was born in Richmond, Indiana in 1929 but spent his formative years in the Pasadena, California area. He graduated from Eagle Rock High School In 1947 and married Alice Jo Shaw in 1953.

Corky was a meat cutter in Southern California. He spent many of his weekends at Huntington Beach body surfing and most of his spare time filming his three son's sporting events. He and Alice retired in Lake Havasu City and Corky realized an almost lifelong dream of restoring his 1932 Ford Truck.

Corky was a veteran of the United States Army. He served during the Korean War. He was preceded in death by his parents; Milton and Phyllis Schneider and his sister; Susan Mitchell.

He is survived by his wife; Alice of Lake Havasu City, his three sons; Bob, John, and Tag and six grandchildren and four great-grandchildren.



Tech Tip

EMERGENCY BRAKE SYSTEM

So you have been building a new hot rod. You put in a big motor, great transmission, and installed a new rear end. You even installed new disc brakes, but one problem is that none of the old emergency braking system will fit the new rear disc brakes. One way is to remove all the old emergency brake parts and install a new electrical emergency brake system. The new E-brake unit uses an electrical power ram and can be installed almost anywhere under the car. The control box can be installed anywhere inside the car. An ON/OFF control button can be installed on the dash with a light or you can install the button in the glove box to act has a anti theft device.

A definition of acceleration.

- *One Top Fuel dragster 500 cubic inch Hemi engine makes more horsepower than the first 4 rows at the Daytona 500.
- * Under full throttle, a dragster engine consumes 3-1/2 gallons of nitro methane per second; a fully loaded 747 consumes jet fuel at the same rate with 25% less energy being produced.
- * A stock Dodge Hemi V8 engine cannot produce enough power to drive the dragster supercharger.

*With 3000 CFM of air being rammed in by the supercharger on overdrive, the fuel mixture is compressed into a near-solid form before ignition. Cylinders run on the verge of hydraulic lock at full throttle.

* At the stoichiometric (stoichiometry: methodology and technology by which quantities of reactants and products in chemical reactions are determined) 1.7:1 air/fuel mixture for nitro methane the flame front temperature measures 7050 degrees F.

*Nitro methane burns yellow. The spectacular white flame seen above the stacks at night is raw burning hydrogen, dissociated from atmospheric water vapor by the searing exhaust gases..

- * Dual magnetos supply 44 amps to each spark plug. This is the output of an arc welder in each cylinder.
- * Spark plug electrodes are totally consumed during a pass. After ½ way, the engine is dieseling from compression plus the glow of exhaust valves at 1400 degrees F. Cutting the fuel flow can only shut down the engine.
- * If spark momentarily fails early in the run, unburned nitro builds up in the affected cylinders and then explodes with sufficient force to blow cylinder heads off the block in pieces or split the block in half.
- * In order to exceed 300 mph in 4.5 seconds dragsters must accelerate an average of over 4G's. In order to reach 200 mph well before half-track, the launch acceleration approaches 8G's.
- * Dragsters reach over 300 miles per hour before you have completed reading this sentence.

*Top Fuel Engines turn approximately 540 revolutions from light to light!

* Remember a run is only 4.5 seconds.

* Including the burnout the engine must only survive 900 revolutions under load.

- * The red line is actually quite high at 9500 rpm.
- * The Bottom Line; Assuming all the equipment is paid off, the crew worked for free, and for once NOTHING BLOWS UP, each run costs an estimated \$1,000.00 per second.

The current Top Fuel dragster elapsed time record is 4.441 seconds for the quarter mile (10/05/03, Tony Schumacher). The top speed record is 333.00 mph. (533 km/h) as measured over the last 66' of the run (09/28/03 Doug Kalitta).

Putting all of this into perspective:

You are driving the average \$140,000 Lingenfelter "twin-turbo" powered Corvette Z06. Over a mile up the road, a Top Fuel dragster is staged and ready to launch down a quarter mile strip as you pass. You have the advantage of a flying start. You run the 'Vette hard up through the gears and blast across the starting line and past the dragster at an honest 200 mph. The 'tree' goes green for both of you at that moment.

The dragster launches and starts after you. You keep your foot down hard, but you hear an incredibly brutal whine that sears your eardrums and within 3 seconds the dragster catches and passes you. He beats you to the finish line, a quarter mile away from where you just passed him. Think about it, from a standing start, the dragster had spotted you 200 mph and not only caught, but nearly blasted you off the road when he passed you within a mere 1320 foot long race course.

That folks, is acceleration
